Came across debris of a recent skier-triggered <u>slide</u> near the top of Little Ellis in a small, protected, eastern facing gully around 7,500'. Crown was ~3.5-1.5' deep, ~35' wide and it ran ~150'. Ski tracks were observed near the top of the crown and next to a small hole near the surface ~70' from the crown where it looks like someone self extracted. No signal was found with a beacon search and my group felt that the one <u>track</u> from the hole must have been from the same skier as the <u>track</u> near the crown.

There was around 2-3' of heavy new snow at that location.
